

INTRODUCTION

This directory of information has been collated to support patients who are living with cancer, but also for carers, clinicians, and staff within primary and secondary care to highlight the support available for our cancer patients. This will include charities, voluntary sector, support groups, secondary care, primary care, hospices, and any other support services which are accessible to our patients in Dudley.

This directory has been separated into categories with a brief description of the support available, how to refer and contact details. Many of these support services patients can self-refer too, it will be highlighted in the contact information if a health care professional is required to complete the referral. In addition, there are specific sections on cancer types based around illnesses and cancer groups. It is important patients, their families and carers are aware of what is available should they need it, and patients are cared for beyond a cancer diagnosis.

LWBC PERSON CENTRED CARE INTERVENTIONS (PCC): HOW TO GET SUPPORT?

WHAT IS PERSON CENTRED CARE INTERVENTIONS?

In this section you will find information around person centred interventions and how to access them. It is important to understand these areas to identify what you may need support with and what services are available.

Person centred care focuses on the whole person and involves shared decision making, as well as better communication between health professionals and patients. It concentrates on what is important to the patient. A person-centred approach is about wellbeing, prevention, care, and support. Being person-centred is about focusing care on the needs of individual. Ensuring that people's preferences, needs, and values guide clinical decisions, and providing care that is respectful and responsive to them.

Thanks to our ever-improving survival rates, more and more people are surviving for longer with or beyond cancer. We are committed to making sure that everybody receives the personalised care and support they need, when they need it, to live a happy and healthy life beyond a diagnosis of cancer.

The National Cancer Survivorship Initiative (NCSI), the NHS long term plan, NHS England and improvement outlined The Recovery Package which is now known as person centred care interventions. It outlines how essential interventions are that are designed to deliver a person-centred approach. Outlined below are what these interventions are and how to access them:

A HOLISTIC NEEDS ASSESSMENT (HNA) AND CARE PLANNING

At your diagnosis consultation you will be given a pack of information, including an HNA. A Holistic needs assessment (HNA) is an assessment, in the form of a checklist of concerns. It gives you an opportunity to think about your concerns and discuss possible solutions. The assessment can be useful at any time after your diagnosis. You answer a simple set of questions about areas of your life, such as:

- Physical
- Practical
- Emotional
- Family and relationships
- Spiritual concerns

Information or support

A discussion takes place with a member of your team/LWBC to identify some possible solutions. This is referred to as a personalised care plan or 'A PLAN OF YOUR CARE'. This can be useful to address any concerns you may have.

A TREATMENT SUMMARY

A Treatment summary is a document formulated from Somerset (SCR) Cancer register. Somerset cancer register is a database where The DGOH stores all its cancer records. The treatment summary is a simple summary of a patient's cancer diagnosis, treatment, and an ongoing management plan. The treatment summary (T/S) is completed on the SCR database, shared with the patient, and emailed to the GP

The Treatment Summary template was designed by the National Cancer Survivorship Initiative (NCSI). It is a document produced by secondary cancer care professionals at the point of when a management plan is agreed, at the end of treatment, change of treatment or if the patient is for best supportive care. It provides important information for GPs, including possible treatment toxicities, information about side effects and/or consequences of treatment, medication, signs, and symptoms of a recurrence, follow up and any actions for the GP and informs a cancer care review.

The patient also receives a copy to improve understanding of their condition and to provide a summary to share with other professionals and those of their choice, e.g., for travel insurance purposes.

CANCER CARE REVIEW

Informed by the Treatment Summary, the cancer care review is a consultation completed by a GP or practice nurse to discuss the person's personal needs. It is carried out within three months of a cancer diagnosis and covers post-treatment support, financial impact of cancer, patient awareness of prescription exemptions, possible late effects of cancer and cancer treatment and information needs to enable self-management. Some commissioners in England have local incentive schemes to improve quality, timing and/or frequency of the CCR.



If you have a cancer diagnosis you can contact your GP regarding a cancer care review. These normally take place from 4 weeks- 3 months from diagnosis.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING INFORMATION AND CLINICS: LIVING WELL WITH CANCER

People who are living with cancer, and those who have had cancer, often have specific support needs. If these needs are not addressed, it can damage their long-term prognosis and their ability to lead an active and healthy life. These needs can include information about treatment and care options, psychological support, advice about financial assistance and support in managing their condition themselves. Carers also play a vital role in supporting people with cancer and it is important that their needs for information, advice and support are addressed.

A Health and Wellbeing Clinics aim is that everyone who has had a cancer diagnosis and is living with cancer will have access to a Health and Wellbeing Clinic/information. This will provide the support they need to enable them to lead as normal a life as possible.

Clinic Agenda

Each session is delivered by a clinician with expertise in that field. Topics being covered include:

Venue

Clinics are held at Russell's Hall Hospital in the Clinical Education Centre in South Block. The sessions last about two hours and there is time to ask questions as a group or on an individual basis. Staff can attend as well for information about services available if they are looking after cancer patients.

HEALTH AND WELLBEING SESSIONS: BEST SUPPORTIVE CARE SESSIONS

These sessions are a health and wellbeing clinics or one to ones and are specialised for patients who have a palliative cancer diagnosis.

The term palliative care is used to describe a caregiving approach aimed at optimising quality of life. Palliative care is about holistically supporting patients and families with a life-limiting illness. It's sometimes called 'supportive care'. Any treatment that is considered palliative, is not with a curative intent, but has the intention to improve any symptoms & quality of life.

The aim of palliative care is to help you to have a good quality of life – this includes being as well and active as possible, for as long as possible. These sessions will involve the following information/talks:

- Health needs assessment you will have the opportunity to complete one of these during the session
- White House Cancer Support what is available
- Macmillan Citizens Advice and benefits available
- Action Health and what exercise can help you
- Treatments and the effects of treatments
- Palliative care and planning ahead
- Palliative therapies and fatigue
- Preferred place of care
- Lymphedema support
- Psychological support
- Managing your symptoms

CANCER CARE NAVIGATOR ROLE AND YOUR CARE

Cancer Care Navigators at DGOH Contact and Referral

When a patient is referred to the hospital via a rapid access pathway for suspected, their care will be coordinated by a team of cancer care navigators. The patient will be contacted within 2 weeks of the referral.

A cancer care navigator is a band 4 member of staff who will be based within the multidisciplinary team. Care coordination is not one person's role, job, or responsibility. All patients will be provided a leaflet with a contact number, so they have a point of access throughout their cancer diagnosis, treatment, follow up and discharge.

Cancer prehabilitation occurs between the time of cancer diagnosis and the beginning of acute treatment. It includes physical and psychological assessments that establish a baseline functional level, identifies impairments, and provides targeted interventions that improve a patient's outcome. The goal of cancer prehabilitation is to bring the functional status, namely physical capacity, and mental health, to a higher level, which enables the patient to receive all necessary cancer treatments. SDEC: SAME DAY EMERGENCY CARE

Services Available

Getting a cancer diagnosis and having cancer treatment may make patients feel anxious or scared.

SDEC are there to support patients and their families through treatment and if they become or feel unwell whilst on treatment

If patients are having chemotherapy, they are less likely to fight infection:

How do i know if i have an infection?

- Temperature greater than 37.5 or below 35.0
- Uncontrollable shivering, chills or shakes
- Persistant Diarrhoea
- Persistent vomiting or nausea
- Constipation
- Bruising or any bleeding for no apparent reason eg nose bleeds
- A rash
- A cough or shortness of breath
- Discomfort or burning when passing urine
- Any pain, blisters, soreness, redness or any other concerns around the site where your chemotherapy was given



DO NOT WAIT IF YOU THINK YOU HAVE AN INFECTION OR FEEL UNWELL

SUPPORT IN GENERAL PRACTICE (GP)/ PRIMARY CARE

They can offer urgent advice, support, and signpost to appropriate services. GPs can refer for particular service input, however this may differ in each locality. - Occupational therapy
- Physiotherapy
- Any Hospital based service referral

- Social prescribing -integrated plus

CLINICAL NURSE SPECIALIST TEAMS (CNS)

When a patient is diagnosed with cancer they will see a clinical nurse specialist, who is a specialist nurse within that field of expertise. All patients should have a key worker, also known as a Clinical nurse specialist (CNS) or specialist nurse (SP), so they have a point of specialist contact for their care. The clinical nurse specialist will discuss the results with the patient and provide information, including a holistic needs assessment checklist (HNA) and HNA booklet for the patient to complete when they are ready.





WHAT IS SOCIAL PRESCRIBING?

Many things affect your health and wellbeing. GPs tell us that a lot of people visit them feeling isolated or lonely. Or they might be stressed out by work, money and housing problems. Sometimes it's the stress of managing different long-term conditions.

That's where social prescribing comes in. It starts with a conversation. It might be the conversation you've just had with your doctor. Or with another person in the practice team. They will refer you to a social prescribing link worker.

The link worker is there to listen to you, and put you in touch with the people and activities that might help you to feel better.



Your link worker might introduce you to a community group, a new activity or a local club. Or they might help you find legal advice or debt counselling. They might just help you find information and guidance: a bit of inside knowledge on your situation or what local resources there are. They could even support you to create something new such as a gardening club, a fishing group, a 'men's shed' or knit and knatter group.

Social prescribing can help you to have more control over your own health and find ways to improve how you feel in a way that suits you.

Studies show that people get better and feel better faster than those treated with medicine alone. And because it works, it's happening more and more – including here in this area.
